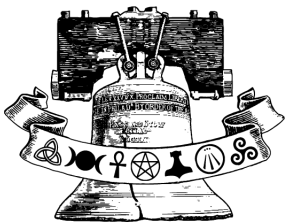
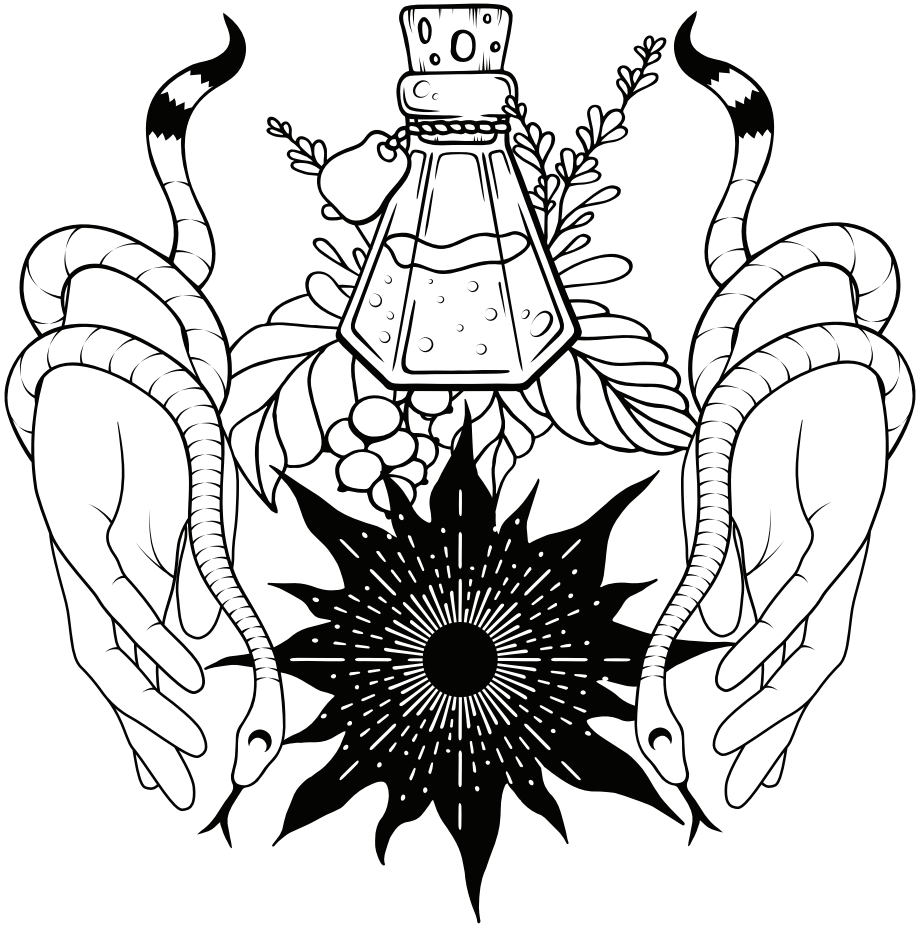
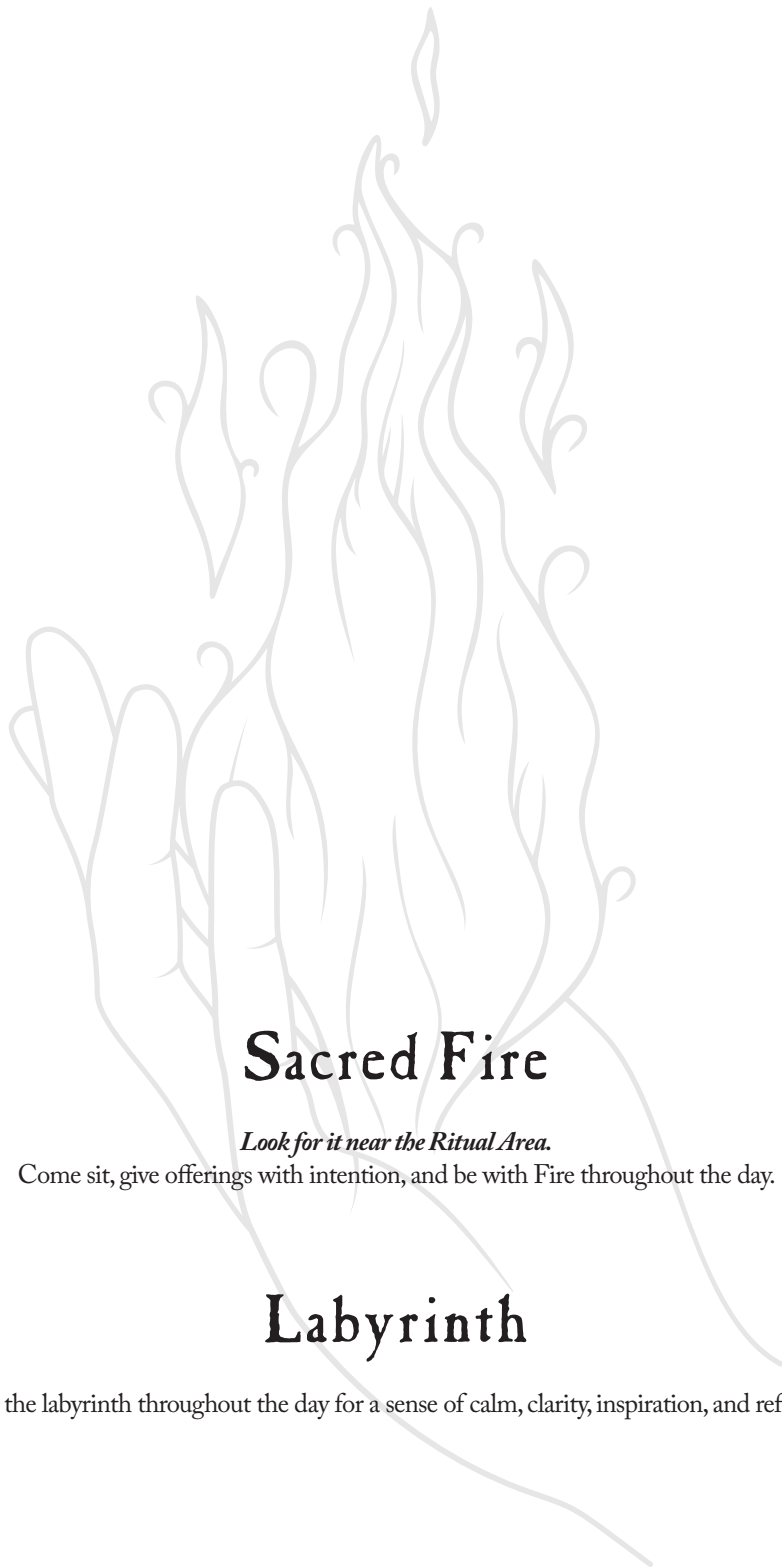

Covid-19 Operating Procedures

Isolate: Event staff, volunteers, vendors, performers, workshop presenters, and general attendees will be notified via email and/or social media posts prior to the event, encouraging people not to attend if they are exhibiting symptoms. Signs explaining the same will be posted at both “Welcome” areas the day of the event.

Masks/Facial Coverings: Event staff, volunteers, vendors, performers, and workshop presenters will comply with any city/county/state/federal orders regarding masks/facial coverings at the time of our event. Should masks/facial coverings be required at the time of our event, we will remove any event staff, volunteers, vendors, performers, and//or workshop presenters from the event area that do not comply with the mask/facial covering order. General attendees not adhering to the mask/facial covering order will be encouraged by event staff to wear a mask. A supply of courtesy masks will be available at both “Welcome” areas the day of the event. We also reserve our vendors the right to refuse service to anyone not adhering to the current mask order.

Distance: Our typical standard spacing for vendors is measured in 10’ x 10’ spaces, allowing approximately 60 total vendors. We will increase this size to 15’ x 10’ spaces, allowing approximately 45 total vendors. This will allow more “padding” on each side of our vendors, allowing more room for people to move between.

Reduce Crowds: We will assign event volunteers throughout the day to walk around the event, looking for large crowds of people and encouraging them to disperse and spread out. Vendors will also be instructed via email communication prior to the event to encourage the dispersal of crowds around their booths.

Barriers: Vendors are given a 15’ x 10’ foot space. Each individual vendor will be responsible for taking their own orders, payments, as well as structuring their space to accommodate social distancing guidelines. Vendors will be strongly encouraged to make use of physical barriers in their spaces, particularly at spaces where payments are made.

Handwashing: Hand sanitizing stations will be provided and maintained by our staff at both “Welcome” areas, portable toilets, performance area, and workshop areas. Vendors will be encouraged to offer a hand sanitizing solution to general attendees on their tables.

Clean: Event staff will regularly sanitize the surfaces of both “Welcome” areas, portable toilets, performance areas, and workshop areas throughout the duration of the event. Vendors will be encouraged to regularly sanitize their wares/tables surfaces throughout the duration of the event.

Communicate: Signage explaining social distancing guidelines, mask/facial covering orders, and hand sanitizing suggestions will be posted at both “Welcome” areas, portable toilets, performance area, and workshop areas. Event staff and volunteers will be directed to be mindful of and address violations of posted pandemic procedures throughout the course of the event.

!!! IMPORTANT PLEASE READ !!!

In recent years we've had a "Westboro-esque" group come to protest our event.

They have the right to protest our event. We have the right to counter-protest.

If the group does arrive, please adhere to the following guidelines.

DO NOT engage them directly in any way.

DO NOT physically touch the protestors on their person and/or their equipment/materials

DO NOT throw projectiles at the protestors.

DO NOT block the street/sidewalk.

DO utilize signs, banners, reflective boards, posters, etc to counter them.

Mirror boards are available at the Welcome Tent. Please return these after the protestors disburse.

DO utilize noisemakers, instruments, portable speakers, etc. to drown out their noise

Complimentary noisemakers are available at the Welcome Tent!

***BUT** please also be mindful of ongoing workshops and our keynote speaker!*

Our goal is to **SAFELY** and **RESPONSIBLY** drown them out with revelry while also promoting a positive image for the Pagan community.

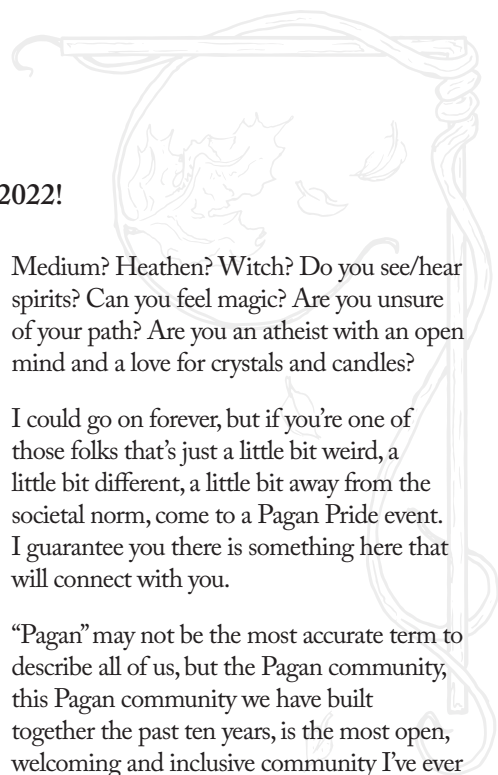
By responding in a way fitting the nuisance they are, we demonstrate that they have no power over us.

Last year, we had the privilege of sharing the park with some unexpected guests, the lovely organizers of the Books are Treasures Foundation.

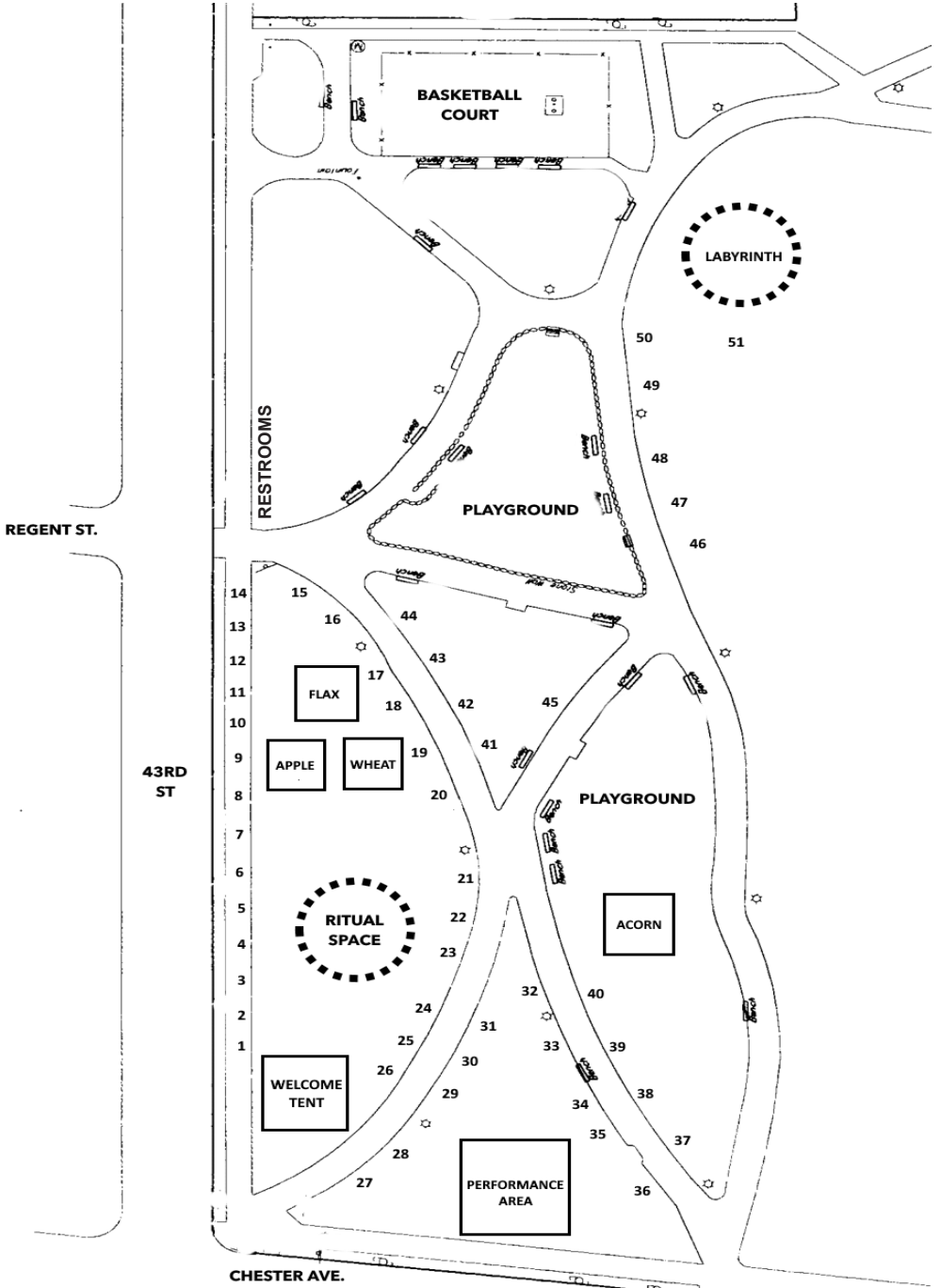

Diana L. Paxson

Keynote Speaker

Diana L. Paxson is an Elder in the Troth and in the Covenant of the Goddess, and a frequent presenter at festivals and conferences. She has worked in a variety of traditions, including kabbalistic ceremonial magic, women's spirituality, Wicca, Umbanda, but is best known for her work in the Germanic Heathen tradition.

In 1978 she founded Darkmoon Circle, a women's coven which is still going strong. It became the grandmother circle of The Fellowship of the Spiral Path, an association of related circles in the San Francisco area. In 1982 she was consecrated as a Priestess by Spiral. In 1988 she started a rune class that evolved into Hrafnar kindred. In 1993 she became active in the Troth, an international Asatru organization, in which she edits its journal, *Idunna*, and coordinates the Clergy training program.

Paxson first came to the attention of the wider pagan community as the author of many novels and short stories with mythological and spiritual themes, including *The White Raven*, the *Wodan's Children* trilogy, the *Westria* series, and the later *Avalon* books. For many years she wrote a regular column on goddesses for *Sagewoman* magazine. More recently she has focused on non-fiction, including *Taking Up the Runes*, *Essential Asatru*, and *Odin*. She is also recognized in the Heathen community for leadership in the recovery of "high-seat" seidh, the Old Norse oracular tradition. This work is presented in *The Way of the Oracle*. She is also the author of *Trance-Portation and Possession, Depossession and Divine Relationships*.

A more recent project is "RARAS", Reclaiming and Re-energizing American Symbols, a group working to apply pagan spiritual skills to revitalize American political consciousness, discussed in her current work-in-progress, *Carrying a Torch for Liberty*.

Workshops

Introduction to Druidry

Druidry is one of the many Pagan traditions found today, drawing from the religion of ancient Celts and other Indo-Europeans. In this workshop, Red Oak Grove will explain how the ancient religions are revived into modern lives, especially as done in Ar nDraiocht Fein, an international druid organization.

Qigong for Everyone: Alchemy of the Taoist Five Animals/Elements

This Mindful Movement Meditation practice cultivates centering the Mind, steadying the Heart and aligning the Body with the Breath. The practice incorporates movements from Taoist Qigong (Chi-kung) techniques based on Animal forms that are also associated with specific Elements which have the capacity to bring healing to correlating parts of the body.

The Goddess in the Labyrinth

The Labyrinth embodies the womb of the goddess. She is Ariadne, the goddess of the labyrinth; She is the Mother, the womb that gives birth. The labyrinth is a container. As a metaphor, the labyrinth is the transformation of the self. In this workshop, we will discuss the labyrinth and the role of the goddess within this sacred form. We'll experience charging our inner goddess as we open the labyrinth through song, chant, and poetry.
